The other notable work that Anuvibha and its associated organizations did was that it asked its members to help the victims of Covid-19 by providing the following to the needy :

Kindly respond to the SOS Calls from the victims of Covid-19 and enable them to get :

- (1) Oxygen Concentrators if needed for home isolation.
- (2) Food Packets
- (3) Medicines
- (4) Good Books to Read
- (5) Oximeters

Anuvrat volunteers across India did hard work and helped people in need. They also identified hospitals where beds were available and guided them how to get admitted. Many volunteers did this altruistic work enthusiastically and saved lives.

ANUVIBHA also noted that on the one hand there were selfless volunteers who were wiping the tears of the family who lost their dear ones to Covid-19, were donating money to help the poor to buy medicines and distributing food packets, some demonic forces were cashing in on the suffering of the people. There were greedy doctors in hospitals who were fleecing the hapless victims, autoricksha and taxi drivers who charged unreasonable amounts for taking patients to hospitals, ambulance owners who demanded unimaginable amount to take dead bodies to the cremation grounds and shopkeepers who were selling life saving injections and oxygen concentrators in black markets, there were health workers who were seen stealing mobile phones, purses and other previous belongings of the dead patients. Anuvrat volunteers became vigilant and swung into action. They kept a watch and reported the cases of immoral exploitation of patients and their kith and kin to police. They also talked to offenders and persuaded them to give up such sinful acts. Vigilant Anuvrat Workers encountered some such people and prevailed upon them to have a change of heart and give up the sinful path.
